Meet at 5:00 am for breakfast... OR... meet at the launch at 6:30 am.

<u>Directions to Spiffy's</u>: I-5 South past Olympia. Take the US-12 E exit- EXIT 68- toward MORTON / YAKIMA. Turn LEFT onto AVERY RD W / US-12. Continue to follow US-12. End at Spiffy's Restaurant: 110 Us Highway 12, Chehalis, WA 98532

<u>Directions to Silver Lake Public Launch</u>: Take I-5 south; Take Exit 49 (Spirit Lake HWY 504); Take left off exit and go back over I-5 (Should pass a Burger King); Stay straight for Approximately 8-9 miles (Past the Silver Lake Motel & Resort); Public launch is on the right hand side.

Remember, no one stays on the dock at a Fish-In. <u>Everyone floats!</u> You don't have to pre-arrange a back seat for Fish-Ins. If you pre-arrange something with your AmBASSador, that's OK, but just because your AmBASSador can't make it doesn't mean you can't go. THE MORE THE MERRIER!




